Early Registration is underway and we are now receiving applications every day. All of you should have received information by email and 2013 campers should have received it by regular mail. All of the information is also available on the website but here is a quick recap: Deadline is December 31_{st}. If you pay in full you will receive a 15% tuition discount. If you pay the deposit only you will receive a 10% tuition discount. Two other discounts that apply any time of year:

- 1. Receive a discount of \$20 per \$1000 of tuition if you pay by check or cash.
- 2. Receive a \$50 per child discount for campers in the same immediate family.

A summer at Falcon is always a reward in itself but you might as well take advantage of the savings while you can and insure that your camper gets enrolled in their session of first choice.
