	Leaders In Training	

It's the first official day of autumn and the summer of 2014 has drawn to a close. Saying goodbye to another amazing Falcon summer is never easy! Let me catch you up on some of the best activities from our LIT Program.

What is an LIT? The Leaders in Training (LIT) program is designed for campers ages 14-15 that are interested in learn-



ing more about leadership at Falcon from a counselor perspective. It involves a combination of weekly meetings and a variety of hands on activities that include shadowing staff members, acting as a counselor assistant (CA), and learning how to lead a large group game. The final project for the LITs is to create and implement an activity for the younger units during rest hour.

The first session class of LITs worked hard planning a series of water games on the softball field. Campers played Drip Drip Drop (Duck Duck Goose with water) and ran relays where you had to sit on a water balloon until it pops! Despite a cloudy sky, the LITs made the most of the activities with lots of enthusiasm and an excellent job dividing up into roles. Team leaders participated with the groups in every water station to the delight of the younger

campers. Game leaders kept the activities running smoothly by replenishing supplies if needed or adding a new creative twist on the original activity to keep enthusiasm high. Timekeepers made sure campers had the opportunity to complete every station. From set up to clean up, this was a well organized and executed activity full of smiles and laughter from the campers as well as the LITs.

The second session class of LITs decided to move in more of an engineering direction and created structures out of spa-

ghetti noodles and marshmallows. Campers were divided into teams and given the same materials. The groups collaborated to create so many diverse structures! Again, the LITs did a great job assigning roles. Team leaders helped to act as mediators and ensure all participants contributed to the pasta masterpiece. The judges created a rubric to ensure fair scoring and the timekeepers kept the competition on track. The campers cheered in formation to hear the final results of the contest. After the LITs completed the activity, it was time to reflect. The LITs began by drafting a list of the things the group did well, could have done better, and what they learned from the activity. What a rewarding experience to be a part of these campers discovering his/her



leadership path! It was an absolute pleasure to be a part of this program throughout the summer and I look forward to seeing these names on upcoming CIT applications soon.

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
